It was supposed to be a fun afternoon of fishing. The spring break before his freshman year, Toby Carr and three of his friends packed up two four wheelers and headed across the pasture to the family lake. Shortly after arriving, Toby rode his four wheeler towards the other side, hoping for better fishing. He didn't see the big hole under the pasture grass, and he doesn't remember flying through the air and landing on his face, as his four wheeler flipped.

After a helicopter ride to the nearest trauma center, Toby was told he had three broken vertabrae between his shoulder blades. They told him he was lucky, that the way he landed should have left him paralyzed or dead and that God must have protected him. For twelve long weeks, Toby had to wear a hard brace around his torso that the family called his "turtle shell."

"It was hard. I couldn't do anything by myself. I couldn't put on shoes or go to school. I thought I would never play football again." Toby said recently. But after getting out of his turtle shell in July, Toby was miraculously released to play football in September. And he hasn't looked back.

Now a Senior, Toby is excited about the future. The 6'3", 280 pound defensive tackle will be starting for the Warriors, and hopes to help the team to a whole season of victories. "I feel like this is finally the year that our team will not only win districts, but will go all the way to state champions!" Toby answered, when asked how he thought the team was looking this year.

In the stands, cheering for Toby and the Warriors, will be Toby's parents, Todd and Terra, along with his sister, Taryn and most of his grandparents. They know more than a championship is riding on Toby having a good season. He hopes to be recruited to play college football somewhere in Oklahoma. If his plans of playing college ball does not work out, he is not

sure what he'll do. There are lots of things he would like to do, and is leaning towards something in the Aviation Tech field, like his grandfather and uncle.

He knows for sure he will miss his friends and the good times they have had in Maysville. It makes him proud to see each of them planning their futures after high school and to see how they have grown over the years from the kids they were to the adults they are becoming. "I am proud of them. Look at Will Morton, he has been my best friend since the third grade. That kid that used to throw up before football games is now a team captain. He leads us all."

Toby's favorite memory from Maysville High School, the year he, Will Morton, and Connor Williams built an air cannon in Ag. "That thing shot golf balls and tennis balls the length of a football field! After he realized we built something that worked, Mr. Edwards made us turn it away from the houses close to the school for fear we would shoot out their windows!" Toby laughed.

Memories like the air cannon are what Toby says he will miss the most after graduation. Just like those nights sitting on tailgates at the football field, talking about nothing important. But, he knows there will be new memories, with new friends, and he will keep in touch with his Maysville buddies. And, just like he overcame a broken back, Toby plans on overcoming any obstacle in his future the same way... with family, friends, and God to protect him.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Lemon Trifle

Ingredients

- 10 Italian ladyfinger biscuits (from half a 7-ounce package)
- 1/2 cup dessert wine (such as sauternes or sweet sherry)
- 2 cups heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons confectioners' sugar
- 1 cup lemon curd

Directions

1. Place ladyfinger biscuits on a rimmed baking sheet and drizzle with dessert wine; let stand 5 minutes. In a large bowl, whisk heavy cream until soft peaks form.
2. Place 5 soaked ladyfingers in a 2-quart serving bowl. Top with 1/3 cup lemon or raspberry curd, then half the whipped cream. Top with remaining ladyfingers, 1/3 cup curd, and remaining whipped cream; top with remaining 1/3 cup curd. Refrigerate 3 hours (or up to overnight) before serving.
