RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Pumpkin Butter Pecan Gingersnap Rolls

Ingredients

- 1 dough sheet
- 1/3 cup pumpkin butter
- 1/4 cup chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup crushed gingersnaps

Directions

- Preheat oven to 375
- Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Unroll the dough on the paper and cut in half.
- Divide the 1/3 cup between the two halves, and spread across the dough.
- Sprinkle the chopped pecans across the pumpkin butter of both halves.
- Coat each half with gingersnap crumbs.
- Roll each dough from the short side into a log, pinching the seam closed.
- Cut into slices and then bake until golden brown, 15 minutes.
